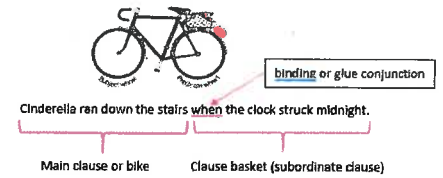
CURRICULUM CORNER

A Bike and Sentences

Baskets on the Back and Front of the Bike

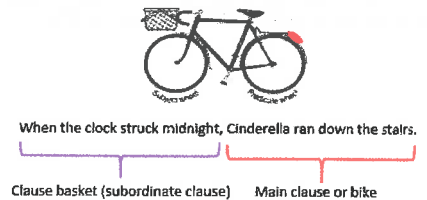
In the last newsletter, we explored complex sentences. These sentences have two or more clauses (a group of words that contains a subject and a verb). One clause can be a sentence or bike on its own, e.g. 'Cinderella ran down the stairs'. The other clause is not a complete thought and needs help to make meaning, e.g. 'when the clock struck midnight'. This clause on

its own does not make sense. It is like a basket that we can attach to a main sentence or bike. This clause starts with a powerful binding or glue conjunction.



When we place a clause basket (subordinate clause) on the back of the bike, we do not need to attach it with a comma as the binding conjunction glues it to the bike.

Did you know that we can also attach clause baskets (subordinate clauses) to the front of the bike?



We need to use a comma to attach a basket to the front of our bike. The comma is like the hooks on the basket.

If students start all their sentences with the subject, their writing can become boring. Starting occasionally with a clause basket, adds variety and flow to their writing.

Here are some more examples of complex sentences:



We went outside as soon as it stopped raining.



As soon as it stopped raining, we went outside.




We can save money if we go to the early movie.



If we go to the early movie, we can save money.
