# NAIDOC Celebrations – Hervey Bay State High School

On Wednesday, 19<sup>th</sup> June, indigenous students from local Hervey Bay schools gathered for a morning full of fun and to learn more about indigenous culture. We were welcomed into the Hervey Bay State High School with a traditional dance from some local people in the bay.

We started off the day by learning the cultural meaning about the songs they danced to. 'Warana' is a traditional song and dance with a great meaning. It's about a bird called the brolga and they were telling us that they knew it was the right time to fish when the brolga dives for food.

Another song we learnt was 'K'gari Inarmi' which is a welcoming dance. They taught the kids how to count to 3 in Butchulla; kalim (1), bula (2) and guurabanda (3). We got to try out a podcast and set up and learn how it feels to be in a real podcast. Overall everyone had a fun filled morning and we loved all the activities they offered us.
